What have been our successes during 2021/2022

We can look back at a successful but another difficult year at Penmorfa due to the continued pressures of Covid 19. At the beginning of the year however, we set ourselves targets for improvements and we have seen progress in all areas.

Implementation of new literacy programme (RWInc) to raise standards in reading and writing across the school.

All staff have been trained in RWInc. Literacy books have been monitored and there was a consistent approach to RWInc being delivered across the school. Half termly RWInc assessments have been carried out and a provision has been offered to provide 1:1 tuition for targeted pupils in the afternoon. Talk for teaching has taken place, which has given staff the opportunity to observe and share good practice from RWInc sessions. Data has been tracked to ensure progress. Class teachers have been collaborating with schools in the cluster and are continually developing.

Implementation of WRM to raise standards of maths and numeracy across the school.

All staff completed White Rose Maths Training and resources were ordered and distributed across the school. The teaching of both fluency and reasoning has been developed across the school. Talk for Teaching took place to support professional development. Digital trackers for WRM have been developed and data is analysed to ensure progress. Pupils are using concrete, pictorial and abstract methods to solve maths problems and have access to a variety of resources in the classroom. Staff are using small steps to inform planning and these are recorded on weekly plans.

To continue with the implementation of the New Curriculum

Cluster planning meetings have taken place for each year group to discuss big questions, delivery approaches and planning documentation. Planning documents were finalised. All pupils are showing individual progress in their own way. Lots of good work has been done this year on curriculum enhancement days and visits.
